### A LETTER FROM THE STEINBERG FAMILY

To the Wonderful Vacation Village Community,

An Aron HaKodesh serves two purposes. First and foremost, it houses our sacred Torah. As a protective covering, the Aron derives holiness from its content. In fact, when Moshe descended Har Sinai with the second set of the Ten Commandments, God instructed him to make an Aron just for that reason: create a safe and secure environment.

Yet the Aron serves a greater need than merely a box for the Scroll of the Law. As its name implies, the Aron HaKodesh is holy in its own right. Indeed, it is on a higher level of sanctity than even a Beit Knesset. The Aron introduced the novel notion that the outwardly physical must reflect its inner spiritual nature; there can be no contradiction, in the words of the Rabbis *"tocho k'boro."* Just as the Aron manifests spirituality because of the Torah inside, so must a person radiate holiness from his neshama.

My father followed Rava's Talmudic dictum (Yoma 72b) that a wise man must be righteous inwardly and outwardly with no discrepancies between public and private conduct, thus mirroring the Ark's lesson. Moreover, the Ark's status is unrelated to the number of scrolls contained therein—it doesn't matter if there is one or there are ten. My father, too, did not consider himself more worthy the seventh time he completed the Talmud than the first. He lived life with gusto, enjoying every moment, and treated all he received as a gift from God, from the physical (like the gefilte fish and herring at your sumptuous kiddushes) to the spiritual (lectures and shiurim).

Nearly three years ago, my father went to his eternal resting place in heaven. Last year, my brave and courageous mother moved to Jerusalem, our eternal City. (At the age of 90, she may have been the oldest person in 2018 to make Aliyah.) With very fond memories of Vacation Village, she misses all of you and sends her warmest regards.

Were my father alive at this dedication, I believe he would have made one request: Please do not gaze too long at the lovely Aron, instead study the beautiful words inside. May you all merit to regularly open the Aron for many years to come.

### Shabbat Speaker - Dr. Efraim Chalamish

### "Israel Between 2 Elections - Economy and Security"



Israel is gearing up for its second national elections in less than 6 months. What are the economic and security issues facing the nation? To understand the workings of the Israeli coalition government with its mandated 61 "kolot" majority, we turn to Dr. Efy Chalamish.

Dr. Efraim Chalamish is an international economic law professor, advisor, and commentator. He has been involved in international legal practice in New York, Paris and Israel, along with research and analysis of cutting edge areas in public and private international economic law. His work has included both international arbitration disputes and cross-border transactions for multinational clients and sovereign governments. He has also served as a Global Fellow at New York University, exploring global governance of corporations and multilateral institutions, the intersection of business and national security, energy and sovereign wealth funds' economics and policy, international investment arbitration, and global governance and financial regulation. He has advised the Israeli government and Israel's Prime Minister's Office on related matters, such as the oil and natural gas industry in Israel. He is the founder and president of the Global Center for Economic Development and Security.

Dr. Chalamish received his Doctorate in international economic law from the University of Michigan. He was awarded the Olin Law and Economics fellowship.. He also attended Bar Ilan University, where he received his LL.B, Master of Laws and MBA in Finance. Among his many awards, citations and activities Dr Chalamish serves as a board member and a Permanent Representative to the United Nations of the International Association of Jewish Lawyers.

### Dvar Torah

from Dr. Elliot Grossman

We say סַבְרִי מֶרָנֶן וְרַבּוֹחַי before we recite the אָידוּשׁ of אַידוּשׁוּת and בְּרָשׁוּת before we recite the אָרָכָה of הַמוּצִיא לָחָם מָן הָאָרַץ. .

The word הַבְרִי means "pay attention to ..." The word בְרְשׁוּת means "with your permission." What are we calling attention to and what do we need permission to do?

The Shibolei HaLeket [ a Rishon from the mid 1200s] explained that the Torah records the proper use of wine as well as how the misuse of wine can lead to catastrophic results. Before we recite קידוש , we call to everyone's attention that we are about to drink wine for the "proper" purpose.

The Halacha requires one who makes the הָּאָרֵץ of הָאָרֶץ to eat from the bread right after its recitation. If one is serving at a table of guests, he must ask permission from those present to eat a piece before distributing to them, so it should not appear as though he is being rude by taking for himself before offering to others.
