

Dvar Torah for Rosh Chodesh

We say in the מוֹסַף שֵׁל רֹאשׁ חֹדֵשׁ:

קָנְיוֹ הָעָיִר עִזְים נַעֲשֶׂה בְּרָצוֹן הָכִין, וְעוֹלַת רֹאשׁ חֹדֵש נַעֲלֶה עָלָיו, וּשְׂעִירֵי עִזְים נַעֲשֶׂה בְּרָצוֹן

וּבַעַבוֹדָת בֵּית הַמְּקְדָשׁ נִשִׂמַח כָּלָנוּ,

We pray for the rebuilding of the בֵּית הַמִּקְדָשׁ and the מִזְבַּהַ when we will, once again, offer the מִּצְרֵי חַטָּאת רֹאשׁ חֹדָשׁ on שְׁעֵרֵי חַטָּאת.

The Gemara [Shavuot 2a-b] teaches that the אֲלַבֶּר of מַבֶּבֶּר for the מְלַבֶּפֶּר and the רְאשׁ חֹדָשׁ of either entering the אֲלַבָּר or eating קַדְשִׁים while in a state of מָמָבָה.



that in the days of the מַשִּׁיהַ there will no longer be any שַּמְאַה .

So why will we be bringing שְׁעֶרֵי הַטָּאת on רֹאשׁ חֹדֵשׁ ? What are we saying in this prayer?

Rav Nevedzal explained that a הֵּרְבֶּן הָטָאת הֵלְּבֶּר is brought as a הַּיּוֹב and is not brought voluntarily – בָּרְצוֹן . The prayer is that in the future, we will bring these שָׁעֵרִי עִזִים as voluntary offerings – like an עוֹלָה . Then they will be נַצְעָבוֹדָת בֵּית הַמִּקְדָשׁ נִשְׂמֵח כָּלָנוּ and we will all rejoice in the holy service נַבְּעָבוֹדַת בֵּית הַמִּקְדָשׁ נִשְׁמַח כָּלָנוּ.
