Securing American Jewish Communities in an Age of Anti-Semitic Terror Attacks

Our anxiety regarding security has been heightened in recent years by not only the horrific shootings in schools and facilities around our United States but also by the senseless slaughter of our fellow Jews in the synagogues in Pittsburgh and San Diego. What should our response be as American Jews? We've taken steps to enhance the security of Vacation Village as well as our community shuls back home. Is there more we ought to do?

Enter Jonathan Stern, new homeowner in Vacation Village and security expert.

Yonatan Stern was born in Liberty, NY and made Aliyah with his family to Kiryat Arba-Hebron in 1997.

He attended the Yeshiva High School of Kiryat Arba and enlisted in the IDF as a combat soldier in the religious Nahal Haredi battalion during the second Intifada. He was trained as a marksman at the IDF's prestigious Mitkan Adam training school and was later in charge of security at the IDF Central Command. Yonatan also volunteered in the Israel Police during that turbulent period and participated in the arrests of Palestinian terrorists attempting to infiltrate his settlement. After discharge from the military and spending two years in yeshiva, Yonatan studied counter-terrorism at the IDC Herzliya Institute for Counterterrorism under world-renowned counter-terrorism expert Dr. Boaz Ganor.

In 2007, Yonatan moved back to the US where he identified the need for Israeli counter-terror tactics and firearms training to be made available to American Jewish civilians. He became an NRA Certified Firearms Instructor and Range Safety Officer and founded his firearms and counter-terrorism training school, Cherev Gidon Israeli Tactical Training Academy, in Honesdale, PA. Today, Yonatan is a widely recognized firearms instructor, security consultant, and expert in the field of counter-terrorism, who specializes in training Jewish communities across the US to respond to active shooter threats. He consults regarding the establishment of security protocols at synagogues, camps, and other institutions, and has appeared in the international media. Yonatan will be addressing the topic of securing American Jewish communities in an age of anti-semitic terror attacks.

Please join us on Shabbat at 5:15 to hear Yonatan share his assessment, advice and expertise on this timely subject.

D'var Torah

In chapter 30 verse 6, the Torah says *וּמִלְד' אֱלֹהִים אֶת לְבָבְךָ לְאֵת לְבַב יִרְעָךְ*.

There is a hint in this verse of the month of *אֱלוּל*. The B'nei Yisaschar said that it is in this month that we are to change ourselves by doing *תְּשׁוּבָה וּמַעֲשִׂים טוֹבִים* and become better individuals. Interestingly, *אֱלוּל* is the sixth month and as the Gemara [Avoda Zara 3a] says *יֵאָכֵל בְּשַׁבָּת שְׁבַת, מִי שֶׁטָּרַח בְּעָרֵב שַׁבָּת, - one who prepares for Shabbos, on Friday, the sixth day of the week, will eat on Shabbos. So, too, one who prepares properly for Rosh HaShana during the 6th month, Elul, will have done his best to achieve a k'siva v'chasima tova.*

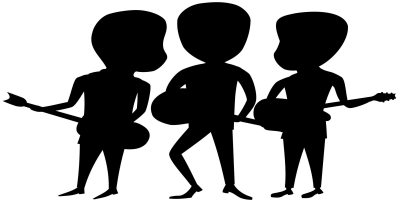
