

Shabbat Speaker - Rabbi Moshe Beredis

" Israel / Latest Developments and the Need for Unity".

As we approach Tisha B'Av, the culmination of the 3 weeks, the period known as *Bein haMetzorim*, we mourn the destruction of both Batei haMikdash, which resulted in our exile from Eretz Yisrael. We know the many theories as to why we were afflicted with this day of loss, grief, tears and pain. One such theory was the *Sinat Chinam*, the baseless hatred among the Jews, directed at one another, and the glaring lack of unity. The concept and practice of unity, "Achdut" remains an all important value among us Jews, here and in Israel.

To explore this concept of unity, this Shabbat we are privileged to hear from a master educator and Jewish scholar, **Rabbi Moshe Beredis**. For the past twenty years, Rabbi Beredis has taught and lectured in the Brooklyn Sephardic community, at Touro and Brooklyn College, and at Magen David Yeshivah High School. He has inspired many students, and was involved in community service by teaching and assisting Jewish immigrants from Syria.

Part of his success as an educator is his style of lecturing in a clear and interesting way which, in turn, teaches his students speaking and analytical skills. He has developed and presented many elective courses and lectures which provoke student thought and participation.


Rabbi Beredis holds a Master's degree in Jewish History. He authored four volumes on Jewish law which include responses and commentary. Additionally, he has conducted research relating to the Holocaust and he created a new and enriching course which served not only to teach modern Hebrew to non-Hebrew speakers, but included the philosophical underpinnings and structure of the Hebrew language as it evolved over the millennia.

After we read from the Torah, the Torah is lifted to show three columns [no more are necessary] and we recite אָשֶׁר שָׁם מֹשֶׁה לְפְנֵי יְשֶׂרְאֵל, עַל פִּי ד' בְּיַד מֹשֶׁה , וְזֹאת הַתּוֹרָה אֲשֶׁר שָׁם מֹשֶׁה לְפְנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל, עַל פִּי ד' בְּיַד מֹשֶׁה .

Actually, this statement is composed of a full pasuk from next Shabbos' section – Chapter 4 verse 44 – and a piece of verse 23 from Chapter 9 of בַּמְדָבָּר.

Usually, we are prohibited from reciting only portions of Torah verses, but the הַבְּנָן who wrote the הַבְּילוֹת, intentionally combined parts of verses to convey their thoughts in a prayer. For example, the well-known verse ד' מָלְדָּ, ד' יִמְלֹדְּ, ד' יִמְלֹדְּ לְעֹלֶם וְעֶּד actually made up of parts of three different verses. The בַּנָן wanted to emphasize the concept that HKBH "was, is and will always be." So, what did the שant us to understand from the addition of the phrase

צַל פִּי ד' בִּיַד משׁה?

Last week, we read the end of Sefer בַּמְדְבָּר. The final verse is בַּמְדְבָּר יִשְׂרְאֵל בְּעַרְבֹת מוֹאָב עַל יַרְדֵּן יְרֵחוֹ אֵלֶה הַמִּצְוֹת וְהַמִּשְׁבָּטִים אֲשֶׁר צִּוָה ד' בְּיַד־מֹשֶׁה אֶל־בְּנֵי יִשְׂרְאֵל בְּעַרְבֹת מוֹאָב עַל יַרְדֵּן יְרֵחוֹ The last verse in sefer וְיִקְרָא is

אָלֶה הַמִּצִוֹת אֲשֵׁר צְוָה ד' אָת־מֹשֵׁה אֵל־בָּנֵי יִשֹׂרָאֵל בְּהַר סִינֵי

The difference between the Torah conveyed by מֹשֶׁה to בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל at בְּנִי יִשְׂרָאֵל and what he conveyed to them 38 years later, just before he died in עַרְבֹּת מוֹאָב, is contained in the words בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל . The Netziv taught that during the years בְּנֵי יִשְׂרָאֵל were in the מִדְּבָּר, Moshe explained to them the laws of the written Torah. Now, just before he died, מֹשֶׁה "gave over" to us the methods by which to derive the Halachos from the words of the written Torah and to arrive at the proper בְּשָׁבָּע – judicial ruling. The בְּבָּנֶן wanted us to know that when we look at the words in the written Torah, we should understand that there is also a תּוֹרָה שֶׁבְּעַל בֶּה which enables us to derive the Halachos to be applied to our daily lives.
